WORSHIP



ACOLYTES

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

JUBILATE (K - 5TH CHOIR) - CANTATE (6TH - 12TH EMSEMBLE)

Our young musicians sing during the 10:15 Sunday worship services from September through May. They also have a special Christmas program, and a Spring performance. On special occasions, we also visit retirement homes and assisted living facilities with song selections during the year.

Rehearsals are every Wednesday in the St Nicholas House: Cantate from 4-5PM and Jubilate from 5-6PM.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH PROGRAMS

During the 10:15AM Sunday service, the St. Nicholas House is open to all elementary students for Children's Church. Parents can drop their students off starting at 10AM where the children can enjoy free play until we begin at 10:15. Our lessons mirror the weekly gospel lesson, and we learn through a variety of fun activities that change week to week: video, discussion, drama, arts and crafts, games, and scripture memorization! During announcements, we walk together as a group and join the main service where the children can receive communion with their families.

Because supervision is required to be two or more adults, volunteers are always needed.

Curriculum training is provided. May require completing the diocesan "Safe Church, Safe Communities" abuse prevention training.

GREETERS

Our greeters provide the hospitality component of our Invite Welcome Connect ministry. They arrive early and are stationed at the welcome table in the narthex. With a smile on their face, they greet our guests, provide our “Red Bag” and offer the Welcome card to be filled out by the guest. They escort the guests to a seat in the sanctuary and introduce them to the members around them. We have greeters at both services.

LAY EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

The Lay Eucharistic Minister (LEM) assists in the central act of the Christian liturgy, assisting the feeding of the faithful with the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This ministry is understood as a sacred trust. In order to be faithful in this work, the LEM must be prepared through prayer and training so that their efforts honor God and Christ's sacrificial love.

The Lay Eucharistic Minister must be licensed by the Diocese by request of the Rector. Guidelines for Training include History of Eucharistic Ministry, Altar Guild Guidelines, Personal Preparation, Practice of Ministry in Church, Homes, Hospitals, etc.

Scheduling is done by the church office.

LECTORS

Our Lectors are lay persons trained in reading scripture who are appointed by the Rector to read lessons and/or lead the prayers of the people. Lectors are encouraged to prepare prior to the service to understand the scripture for the day and be prepared for difficult pronunciations.

ST. JAMES CHOIR

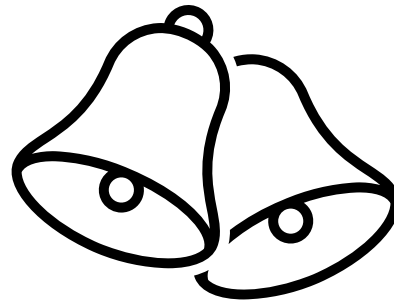


MORE MUSIC

An entire handbell choir is itself a single instrument, with a musician responsible for only one or a very few select notes that, when played together with the other musicians, becomes rich melodies and harmonies.

Rehearsals are Wednesday evenings at 6:00.



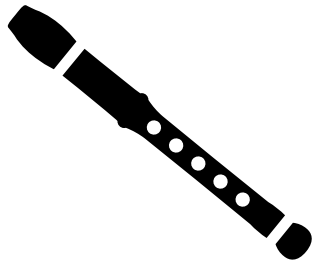

TECH SUPPORT

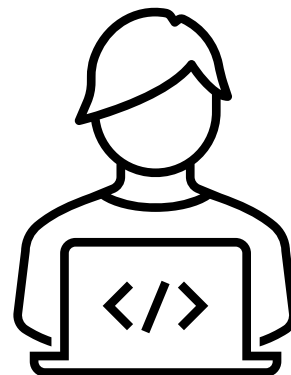

USHERS

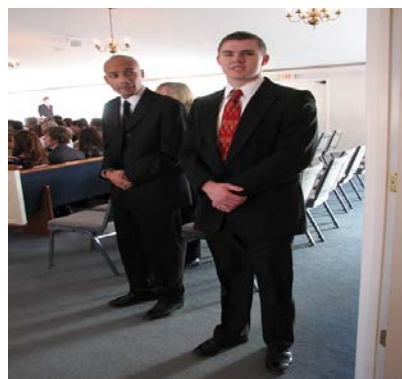
Our ushers are responsible for:

DISCIPLESHIP

ALPHA COURSE

The **Alpha course** is an evangelistic course which seeks to introduce the basics of the Christian faith through a series of videos, talks, discussions and small group activities. It is described as "an opportunity to explore the meaning of life" . A simple meal starts the evening.

The course runs for 11 weeks and includes one Saturday retreat. It runs from 6:00 to 8:00 each evening. Each session stands alone so missing a session is not a problem.

BIBLE STUDY

Bible study at St. James involves reading and examining the Bible to better understand its message and meaning. It involves carefully studying passages, analyzing context, interpreting meaning, and applying truths to our lives. Members supply their own Bibles and the various translations around the table often lead to discussion. A chapter or a section of a chapter is studied with participants encouraged to question or comment.

Once a month the call goes out from the church office asking for volunteers to help maintain the garden.



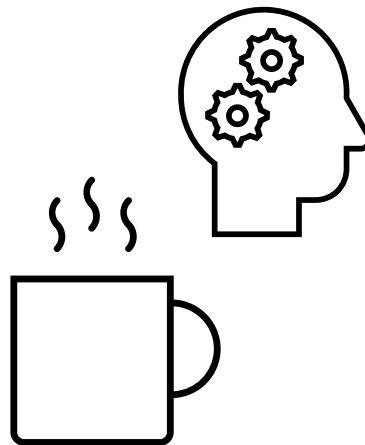

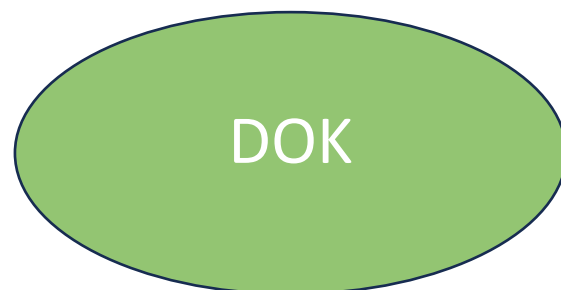

EUCCHARISTIC VISITORS

Supposed you had planned to go to a big family party, and at the last minute you became ill and were not able to attend. Imagine how disappointed you would feel! Someone at the party suggests that they take you a piece of cake from the family celebration, hoping that this would be a way to make you a part of the celebration, even though you couldn't be there physically with the rest of the family. Imagine how wonderful you would feel about being included in a special way.

This is exactly the purpose of the Eucharistic Visitor Ministry. We at St. James do indeed have a big “family celebration” every Sunday, and when someone is unable to be with us physically we feel the loss. We try to make them feel included by taking a part of our feast from Sunday morning directly to them.
