### SANCTUARY REMODELING UPDATE

Progress continues with the remodeling/updating of the Saint James sanctuary. The first project of replacing the seventy year old wiring began in early June and is nearly complete. All that remains for electrical work is some minor tidying up and the installation of circuits to power the new commercial air conditioning system that will replace the existing system located in the choir area.

The flooring project is divided into two phases hardwood and carpet. The first phase of installing hardwood in the choir, altar and organ area began in late June. This phase is nearing completion; currently the flooring in the Altar area has been stained and sealed. The remainder of the hardwood flooring should be completed within another seven to ten days. Exact timing is dependent on the removal of the large air handler located in the choir area that is preventing the final few pieces of hardwood to be installed. Work on the new air conditioning system began the afternoon of July 28. If all goes well the new system should be operating by close of business July 31.



The installation of the new carpet in the pew area is currently scheduled to commence on August 3. If all goes as planned, the carpet plus reinstallation of the pews should be completed in five work days. After that, minor cleaning and set up should take place the week of August  $10^{\rm th}$ .

# WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT... ROMANS 8:28-39
