ADVENT, THE NEXT SEASON TO CELEBRATE DURING THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH YEAR.

"ADVENT always starts on the 4th Sunday before Christmas. This year, that will be Nov. 30th (St. Andrew's Day). This marks the start of the liturgical year, and is the preparation for Christmas. Advent ends on Christmas Eve:

Advent 1st Sunday -Nov. 30, followed by celebrating a week of HOPE for the arrival of the Messiah. Lighting of the Ist candle in our Advent wreath Advent 2nd Sunday -Dec. 7, followed by a week to celebrate PEACE, which Christ brings into the world. Lighting of the 2nd candle in our Advent wreath Advent 3rd Sunday - Dec. 14, followed by a week to celebrate JOY in the coming birth of Jesus. Lighting of the 3rd candle in our Advent Wreath Advent 4th Sunday -Dec. 21, followed by a week to celebrate LOVE, God's selfless love for all humanity, encouraging us to love those in our own lives. Lighting of the 4th candle in our Advent Wreath."

During the whole season we pray, worship and give to those in need. This is a wonderful Christian Season, a time of remarkable beauty and fellowship. In anticipation, Wishing you all a Merry and Hallowed Christmas.


