A Note from Fr. Tom: Current Prospects for In-Person Worship

Greetings St. James Family!

While our on-line services continue to be a blessing for many, I know how anxious we all are to come back for in-person for worship. That's not a decision we can make alone; it must be done in conjunction with the guidelines of our Diocese. Recently our Bishop sent out some extensive "Phase 1" directives for churches who wish to open up as early as May 31st. Those directives include numerous restrictions. Some of these are:

- -25% capacity or less, and social distancing of 6 feet.(12 feet for choir)
- -everyone wearing masks in church;
- -communion only with bread;
- -sanitizing all surfaces between services;
- -no passing the plate at offertory
- -careful orchestration of entering and leaving
- -keeping attendance at every service

We discussed our options at our vestry meeting last week, and decided that we are not ready to open up the church just yet. Some felt that safety was still an issue, and everyone agreed that the numerous restrictions would be too difficult to implement and would impede our enjoyment of the service.

We are delaying our opening for another important reason: we are utilizing our time of separation to undertake some important renovations to the interior or our church. These renovations include:

- -installing new oak wood flooring in the altar, organ, and choir areas
- -installing new carpet on the main floor around the pews;
- -installing all new electrical wiring throughout the whole church.

The current carpet is over 17 years old and has become worn in a number of places. The current electrical wiring goes back to 1947, and is badly in need of an upgrade! We are hoping to start these projects in the beginning of June, and will keep you updated on the progress of each. It is our hope that we can complete these projects around the time that the "Phase 1" restrictions for worship are lifted, so that we can all come back together to celebrate.

We also want to hear back from you. We'll be sending out a survey for you to answer regarding your personal readiness to come back, and what options you might want us to consider for fellowship and discipleship in the meantime. Stay tuned!


