Stewardship Sunday and Ministry Fair

Please join us for our **Stewardship Sunday** on **November 10th**, where we will make our stewardship pledge for 2020, and take part in our annual Ministry Fair. The Ministry Fair will take place in the Parish Hall after both the 8:00 and 10:15 services.



Our Scriptural theme for this year's program is taken from 1st John 2:6: "Whoever says, I abide in him, ought to walk as he walked." This verse forms the basis for our new Parish Mission Statement, which says,

"St. James seeks to be a community that grows more Christlike, expressing the love of Jesus Christ in our worship, our outreach, and our commitment to discipleship."

We have chosen this new Mission Statement, because we know that the only way to grow as a parish is to become Christlike by imitating Christ in how he walked. And how did he walk?

He was faithful in worship. He attended the synagogue. He celebrated the feasts in Jerusalem. He sang hymns with his disciples.

He expressed God's love in outreach. He healed the sick. He went to the outcasts. He proclaimed good news to the poor.

Our Ministry Fair will be arranged according to the areas of Worship, Outreach, and Discipleship. St. James has a rich history of following Christ in all of these. If you have not committed to a ministry yet, or are considering a new ministry, please join us on November 10th as commit to our stewardship for 2020, and seek to grow in Christlikeness.
