





### MUSIC MUSINGS September 2020

Is anyone else weary of 2020, or am I the only one? Don't everyone answer at once now! It has been a daunting, and incredibly weird, year. We keep saying, "I can't wait until things get back to normal." But do we even know what normal is anymore? As I have tried to put this in some kind of spiritual context, I'm reminded of these verses from Romans 5:

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we<sup>[a]</sup> have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup> through whom we have obtained access<sup>[b]</sup> to this grace in which we stand; and we<sup>[c]</sup> boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. <sup>3</sup> And not only that, but we<sup>[c]</sup> also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup> and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup> and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

What I glean from this is that it comes down to perseverance in the faith. We struggle with our circumstances, but God will walk with us through the valleys. We experience pain, but Jesus reminds us that he bore the ultimate pain for all. We grieve losses, both tangible and intangible, but the Holy Spirit seeks to comfort us. So, as difficult as it seems some days, our call is to make choices that are enriching and uplifting, because we live in the Hope that is found only in Jesus. God's love has been poured into our hearts, so let us continue to choose love. There is a song that has become near and dear to my heart, entitled, "I Choose Love." The text was written by Lindy Thompson, set to music by Mark Miller. It is a song of lament, but also one of challenge. I commend this poignantly simple piece to your hearing (you can Google "I Choose Love Mark Miller" to listen on your computer) and hope that you will find it soothing to your soul. Here is the text for the first verse:

"In the midst of pain, I choose love In the midst of pain, I choose love In the midst of pain, sorrow falling down like rain, I await the sun again, I choose love."

Dear friends, let us continue running the race that God has set before us, persevering even in the midst of doubt and pain; let us continue to choose love.
